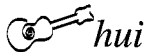


Kaleleonālani

Nu'uānu wrote this for Queen Emma, who took the name Kaleleonālani (flight of the royal ones) after the death of her son, Prince Albert, and then her husband, Alexander Liholiho, King Kamehameha IV. 1870s.
